**AN ORDINANCE OF THE SEGUIN CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING AN ALL-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF JEFFERSON AVENUE AND VOLUNTEER STREET; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND AUTHORIZING CITY STAFF TO SUBMIT THIS ORDINANCE AS A SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that installation of traffic control devices is necessary in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001, the City has general authority to adopt an ordinance or police regulation that is for the good of the government, peace or order of the City and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Seguin:

**Part 1.** The City's engineering department, after receiving a request, undertook a study and determined that the intersection of Jefferson Avenue and Volunteer Street warranted a four way stop.

**Part 2.** A stop intersection is hereby created at the intersection of Jefferson Ave and Volunteer St within the City of Seguin.

**Part 3.** The City's Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to designate the intersection of Jefferson Ave and Volunteer St as a stop intersection in accordance with this Ordinance and is further directed to erect appropriate signs or other markings giving notice thereof.

**Part 4.** Violations of this Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the penalty provisions of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances.

**Part 5.** In accordance with Section 3.10 of the Seguin City Charter, this Ordinance shall become effective upon ten (10) days following passage on second reading and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

**Part 6.** If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable clause or provision shall be severed from the remaining portion of the Ordinance, which shall continue to have full force and effect.
