Spoke to the City Council on Seguin ISD and the new contract regarding Substitute Teachers. The Seguin ISD has entered into a contract with ESS Company, who contracts with sub-teachers. This company hires their own sub-teachers first (preferred list) and then will contact others. Ms. Mendez has always worked at the High School but this company puts the return subs at Middle schools. She said she realizes that there is nothing City Council can do, but wanted to make us aware. Kyle Kramm, Director of Main Street & CVB encouraged everyone to provide their feedback to update the City's Comprehensive Plan and to create a new Downtown Master Plan. Residents are encouraged to have a voice in the forthcoming plans by responding to preliminary surveys for both plans. The surveys are part of a larger effort to engage the community during the plan development process. Ms. Khloe Tovar 2556 FM 467 Seguin, Texas

Ms. Tovar is a member of the Youth Group from Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and she said that the Christmas Season is a time for giving and not sure that everyone is aware, but there were 1,000 refugee families who had to leave Afghanistan. Currently there are 500 refugees in San Antonio with more coming. These families had to leave everything behind. The church is working with the Catholic Ministries to assist in collecting donations. The Youth Group would like to request a donation to the Giving Machine, which would set up apartments for the families. Our goal is to set up at least 150 apartments. They will be at different locations around town and we ask that if you could help please take a tag and buy or donate items as requested.

Council Member Chris Aviles praised the youth group for their dedication and hard work to assist the Afghanistan families. Since he served in Afghanistan he would like to sit with the group and talk about his experiences.
