**Subject:** **Amendments to the Food Truck Ordinance**

**Date:** May 29, 2019

In March 2017, the Seguin City Council adopted an ordinance to allow food trucks to operate within the city limits. The ordinance as adopted defines a food truck as a self-propelled vehicle. Over the past two years, the City has received inquiries and requests for the allowance of food trailers that are pulled by separate vehicles. The City has also received requests to allow a food truck/trailer to remain on a private property for extended periods of time and to increase the number of food trucks/trailers allowed on a single lot from one to two. The ordinance currently states that more than one food truck on a property must meet the requirements of a Food Truck Park.

Considering these requests, staff is proposing to amend the ordinance to include the following revisions:

- Rename the ordinance to regulate Mobile Food Vendors, which is defined to include both food trucks and food trailers.
- Amend the ordinance to restrict the duration of stay for parking and operating on public streets as currently adopted, but remove the limitations for parking and operating on private property.
- Amend the ordinance to define a Mobile Food Park as three or more mobile food vendors.

Attached please find a copy of the Ordinance amendments being proposed. Staff recommends approval of these amendments.
