

Efforts To Date:

- > Executive Team established to develop core policy issues
 - Assistant City Manager
 - Public Information Officer
 - Human Resources
 - City Attorney
 - Public Safety
- ➤ Daily conference call with Texas Dept. of State Health Services
- > Director's Team creating measures to protect employees and citizens including:
 - Social Distancing
 - Work from Home Potential
 - Staggered shifts
 - Increased disinfection practices in work areas
 - Use of Technology for remote meetings
- > Weekly Conference Calls with Hospital starting last week

Hospital Update:

- Preparing for a "Surge"
 - "Surge" pandemic creates a spike greater than the resources
 - Procedures that are elective have been cancelled
 - Personal Protective Equipment
- ➤ Meeting with federal and state health officials including STRAC (Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council) to assist in monitoring of resources for the region
- > 69 Tests Conducted- 13% positive rate
 - 48 Complete- 39 Negative, 9 Positive
 - 21 Pending
- > Private Physicians also have access to tests

Timeline of events:

- **▶** March 17th- Seguin Mayor signs State of Local Disaster
 - Allows the City to request financial aid and assistance
 - Allows the City to take any actions necessary to promote health and suppress the virus
- **▶** March 20th- Governor Abbott signs Executive Order
 - Bans gatherings of 10 or more
 - Dining in restaurants
 - Closing of gyms, bars, massage parlors

Timeline of events:

- **▶** March 23^{rd-} Mayor Signs 2nd Disaster Declaration to include the following:
 - bars, wineries, breweries;
 - restaurant dining rooms (take-out and delivery will remain permitted);
 - gyms, health clubs, fitness clubs, yoga studios;
 - movie theaters;
 - bowling alleys;
 - game rooms and other indoor amusement facilities;
 - private clubs;
 - nail salons, hair salons, barber shops, beauty salons and hair removal services;
 - spas and massage parlors;
 - tattoo and piercing shops, and;
 - other social gatherings, including churches, whether indoor or outdoor, where 10 or more persons congregate and where the business is not providing an essential service.



Timeline of events:

- ➤ March 31st- Governor extends decree to April 30th and suspends school until May 4th. Deems religious activities as essential service but recommends following of CDC guidelines.
- > April 3rd County Judge creates a Stay Safe/Stay Home Order
 - *For All Intents and Purposes, The Governor's Order, the County's Order and the City's Order are all substantially similar*

Working with Big Box Retailers- Walmart, Home Depot, HEB Numerous complaints via social media on overcrowding of stores

- > HEB
 - One Way In- One Way Out
 - Social Distancing Signage
 - Limiting Occupancy During Peak Hours
- > Walmart
 - One Way In- One Way Out
 - > Social Distancing Signage
 - > Limiting Occupancy to 5 customers per 1,000 square feet
- > Home Depot
 - One Way In- One Way Out
 - Social Distancing Signage
 - Limiting 150 customers

- > CDC recommends people wear masks while in public especially when within 6ft of someone.
 - ➤ Encourage community to not use n95s or surgical masks-please leave for health care professionals.

Financial Update

- > General Fund
 - Collected 99.89% of our budgeted revenues through March 26th
 - Sales tax through January 2020- 11.36%
 - ✓ Now collecting on Residential utilities
 - ✓ March Sales tax impact will not be known until May
 - Building Permits- 74.29% of budgeted revenue collected
 - Court Collection and Rental Fees will be down for the months of March and April
 - Travel and Training Budgets not being used
 - Only necessary expenditures are being approved
 - \$2M Emergency Fund

Financial Update

- Utility Fund
 - 92 Payment Arrangements
 - √ 59 paid in full
 - √ 21 have made payments
 - √ 12 have not made payments
 - 45 Accounts that were scheduled for cut off in March that have not made payment arrangements
 - ✓ March and April bills are now due
 - ✓ Balances Range from \$51.39 to \$674.64
 - ✓ Total due is \$16,028.68
 - Strong Fund Balance in Utility Fund

Financial Update

- Utility Fund
 - Utility Assistance Program- administered by Community Council of South Texas
 - Currently limited to \$300 maximum allowance
 - Consideration to increase allowance to \$500

Key Department Changes:

- ➤ All Lobbies closed to General Public including Development Services, Utility Billing, Visitor's Center and Municipal Courts
- > Library Closed but providing drive-thru services
- > Seguin Events Complex closed
- Animal Services- Pet adoptions and reclaims by appointment only
- > All Non-essential boards and commission meetings cancelled
- City events cancelled or postponed until a later date

Key Department Changes:

- Working with Utility Customers to set up payment plans for utilities
- Waived credit card and processing fees in order to encourage citizens to pay on-line
- > Disconnect and late fees for non-payment of utility accounts suspended
- > Developed work from home policy for staff that are eligible
- > Created flex schedules to minimize the number of staff that are in the office at one-time or who have child care issues

Key Department Changes:

- Splash Pad at Park West is closed
- ➤ All City Parks closed Easter weekend; Starcke Golf course closed Easter Sunday; **Wave Pool will be closed this summer-New Info**
- ➤ Parks and Recreation will open employee daycare on March 26th- Did not happen, not enough employee participation- New Info
- **Emergency protocols in place for police and fire**
- > Core services are still being provided throughout the City
