





History of Workforce Development & Higher Education Initiatives in Seguin/NB

2004 to 2016

- CTTC Phase 1 Opens (2004)
 - Partners: City of New Braunfels, City of Seguin, Guadalupe County, NB ISD, SISD, CISD, AACOG, LCRA, NBU, US EDA, NB CoC.
- CTTC Educational Partner: Alamo Colleges
- High School STEM Programming Partner: Alamo Academies

2016 to 2020

- CTTC Expands Footprint, Phase 2 Opens (2016)
 - Partners: City of New Braunfels, City of Seguin, SEDC, NBEDC, Guadalupe County, NB ISD, SISD, CISD, AACOG, LCRA, NBU, US EDA, NB CoC.
- Challenges with Alamo Academies (2017)
- Challenges with Alamo Colleges (2018)
 - Leadership Changes, Lack of Lease Agreement, Maintenance Responsibilities, etc.

2020 to Today

House Bill 4997

- Service area jurisdiction rules previously prevented TSTC from providing their programing without the established district community college first declining to serve as the educational provider.
- Authored by Kuempel & Issac. Sponsored by Campbell
- Passed 6/11/23. Signed by Governor & Effective Immediately
- Allows TSTC to operate by right in Comal and Guadalupe counties.
- Gives TSTC flexibility to immediately bring in new programs without going through the process of offering right of first refusal each time.
- With passage of HB 4997, TSTC now has the authority to build a campus or campuses in Comal and/or Guadalupe Counties.







Proposed Seguin/NB TSTC Campus Details

- Location: Seguin or New Braunfels
- Land Requirement: 80 to 100 acres
- Anticipated to be 1/3 smaller than Fort Bend Campus
- Project Cost: \$100 Million*
- Potential Educational Programs: Welding, Industrial Systems, Robotics & Industrial Controls Technology, Electrical Power & Controls, Machining, HVAC Technology, Line Worker Technology, Diesel Technology
- Earliest Campus Construction would start is 2026/27. Timeline dependent on meeting fundraising goals.



Seguin/New Braunfels Game Plan

- Establish "Task Forces" in each of our respective communities
- Community Task Forces will:
 - Evaluate real estate opportunities in Seguin/New Braunfels that could a fit for a potential TSTC Campus
 - Prioritize real estate opportunities based upon metrics such as population density, proximity to employers that align with the educational programs TSTC offers, accessibility, visibility, access to adequate infrastructure, etc.
 - Develop value propositions that highlight why these real estate opportunities that are an ideal location for a new TSTC campus
 - Identify fundraising targets and other mechanisms to help fund the construction of a new TSTC
 Campus

- TSTC's Newest Campus
- 80+ Acres on I-69 in Rosenberg, TX
- Existing Facilities:
 - Industrial Technology Center 120,000 SF
 - Brazos Center 57,000 SF
 - Faraday Center (Telsa) 6,000 SF
- **Top Industries & Programs:** Engineering/Manufacturing, Transportation, Construction/Maintenance, Computer & IT, Environmental & Safety
- Funding Partners helped raise more than \$40 MM for the Project: Cities of Richmond and Rosenberg, Richmond EDC, Rosenberg EDC, the George and Henderson-Wessendorf Foundations, Fort Bend County, Fort Bend County Business Community








TSTC Site Requirements

- 80 to 100 Acres
- Located on a major thoroughfare
- Easily accessible
- Good visibility
- Proximity to business and industry TSTC serves
- Proximity to high growth population centers
- Located on a major thoroughfare





TSTC Real Estate Focus Areas

- I-35, I-10, SH 46, SH 123 Corridors
- Total 45 Min Population: 1.5 MM to 2.7 MM
- % of Population 18+: 70% to 80%
- Employed Labor Force Population: 1.1 MM to 1.5 MM
- Key Industry Employment:
 - Manufacturing: 64k+
 - Construction: 87k+
 - Utilities: 7.5k+
 - Transportation/Warehousing: 62k+

Site between Seguin and New Braunfels would be ideal (SH 46/SH 123)







Fundraising Opportunities & Funding Ideas

- TSTC Funding Model places new campus funding responsibility solely on the shoulders of Seguin, New Braunfels, Comal and Guadalupe Counties, Business Community, Philanthropic Organizations, etc.
- Fundraising Goal: \$100,000,000.00*
- Once facility is built and operational, TSTC and the State of Texas assume all future operational costs. This is a one-time financial commitment from the local area.

 - Philanthropic Organizations Local, Regional, Statewide, National
 - EDC's Seguin & New Braunfels
 - Governmental Entities
 - Business Community & Corporate Foundations
 - Community At Large
