**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS,
AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF
AGRICULTURE FOR THE FIRE, AMBULANCE AND SERVICE TRUCK (FAST)
FUND; AND AUTHORIZING CITY MANAGER TO ACT AS THE CITY'S
EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IN ALL
MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE TEXAS
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the City Council of Seguin, Texas desires to develop a viable community, including decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low-to-moderate income; and

WHEREAS, certain conditions exist which represent a threat to the public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interests of the City of Seguin to apply for funding under the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That a Texas Community Development Block Grant Program application for the Fire, Ambulance and Service Truck (FAST) Fund is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the City of Seguin with the Texas Department of Agriculture.

SECTION 2: That the City of Seguin's application be placed in competition for funding under the Fire, Ambulance and Service Truck Fund.

SECTION 3: That the application be for up to \$500,000.00 of grant funds to provide for purchase of a Tanker Truck and Brush Truck.

SECTION 4: That the City Council directs and designates the City Manager as the City's Chief Executive Officer and Authorized Representative to act in all matters in connection with this application and the City's participation in the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program.

SECTION 5: That all funds will be used in accordance with all applicable federal, state, local and programmatic requirements including but not limited to procurement, environmental review, labor standards, real property acquisition, and civil rights requirements.

SECTION 6: That it further be stated that City of Seguin is committing \$5,000.00 from its General Fund as a cash contribution toward the administration activities of this Tanker Truck and Brush

Truck project. The City commits to additional match if necessary if at time of funding, the cost of the vehicles is higher than available grant dollars.

SECTION 7: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage.
