AN ORDINANCE OF THE SEGUIN CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING AN ALL-WAY STOP INTERSECTION AT THE INTERSECTION OF CORDOVA ROAD AND HUBER ROAD WITHIN THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City received a request for an all-way stop at the intersection of Cordova Road and Huber Road; and

WHEREAS, the intersection is currently controlled only by stop signs facing Huber Road; and

WHEREAS, city engineers conducted an engineering review of the traffic counts along with a review of the crash history at the intersection; and

WHEREAS, the data review shows that an all-way stop at the intersection of Huber Road and Cordova Road is warranted; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001, the City has general authority to adopt an ordinance or police regulation that is for the good of the government, peace or order of the City and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the City.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Seguin:

Part 1. A stop intersection is hereby created at the intersection of Cordova Road and Huber Road within the City of Seguin.

Part 2. The City's Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to designate the intersection of Cordova Road and Huber Road as a stop intersection in accordance with this Ordinance and is further directed to erect appropriate signs or other markings giving notice thereof.

Part 3. Violations of this Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the penalty provisions of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances.

Part 4. In accordance with Section 3.10 of the Seguin City Charter, this Ordinance shall become effective upon ten (10) days following passage on second reading and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

Part 5. If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable clause or provision shall be severed from the remaining portion of the Ordinance, which shall continue to have full force and effect.
