WHY?

- Previous Seguin radio infrastructure originally deployed in 2006
 - Hardware production of Seguin's radio infrastructure ceased on 9/30/2011
 - Last ship date of hardware 12/31/2013
 - End of support scheduled for 12/31/2020
- A study published in March 2011 by AACOG identified the following
 - Gaps in the existing system
 - No interoperability with regional counterparts
 - Major disaster response concerns



PROJECT 1 - RADIO INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADE

- Assessments began in October 2018; LCRA platform chosen in January 2019
 - Chosen platform approximately one half the cost of competing quotes
- Requirements:
 - Upgrade radio infrastructure to a P25, 700 MHz 5 channel, phase II
 - New radio building behind 123 water tower
 - Extended natural gas line to site for generator back up
 - Cored into tower for interconnect
 - Release previously utilized radio frequencies
 - Region 53 700MHz Public Safety Planning Committee approval November 17, 2020





PROJECT 2 - END USER RADIO INTEGRATION

- Purchase, integration, and deployment of 227 handheld, mobile, and base station radios
 - Took two weeks in August 2020
 - 113 vehicles with mobile radios had to be upgraded (AS/PD/FD/Utilities)
 - 105 portables distributed
 - 7 dispatch radios + 2 base stations (Utilities/PW)





PROJECT 3 - DISPATCH

- Migrated onto LCRA radio network in August 2020 to allow for Dispatch renovations to take place
 - Dispatch operated out of Bexar Metro from 8/17 9/18/2020
 - 6 New consoles
 - New furniture
 - New battery backups for PD building
 - New city issued refresh computers
 - Collaboration with LCRA, Bexar Metro, Electra Link, and city staff to complete work within short timeframe
 - Renovated the space (Facilities, Electrician, etc)
- Voice Recording platform upgrade
- Established talk and interoperability channels for internal and external comms
- Release previously utilized radio frequencies







VICTORY!

- Seguin joins a regional consortium of 70 tower sites covering:
 - 22,237 sq miles of 700MHz radio coverage
 - 18,000+ public safety radios on the LCRA system
- Regional interoperability opportunities
 - Cities: NB, SM, Schertz, Selma, Universal City, Cibolo, Marion
 - Counties: Guadalupe, Comal, Hays, Bexar, Gonzales, Wilson, Caldwell
 - Guadalupe County entities: Geronimo VFD, Sand Hills VFD, Marion VFD, New Berlin VFD, York Creek VFD,
 - ISD's: Judson, Hays
 - Other: TLU, SSLGC, GAATRS
- Future growth
 - City went from 5 to 6 dispatch consoles to meet projected growth of the city
 - Door is open for future interoperability with regional counterparts
- LCRA radio services contract stipulates if infrastructure needs to be upgraded it will be covered by LCRA
- Project was completed with all associated aspects at two million less than the other primary option
- Auction off old radio platform

 - Citywide security awareness training to meet TX HB 3834 compliance
 - Completed DHS cyber resilience review
 - Second mutual aid ILA across Texas with NB, SM, and Texas State
 - City of Seguin and SSLGC's risk analysis and emergency response assessment for APWA
 - Tyler Tech, Microsoft, Gallagher and TXDoT were hit with cyber incidents

- Completed SSLGC Nixon Ops building & Golf Pro Shop
- Year two/three network infrastructure upgrade
- Year one/two systems infrastructure upgrade/migration
- Completed FY19-20 5-year computer capital refresh, began FY20-21
- SCADA upgrade, long standing project to tie in iPads and display at UOC/WP
- Video intercom at the Annex (employee safety)
- Integrated Adobe's Large Government Account (LGA) program
- Averaging 478 support tickets p/ month
