Effective Tax Rate is \$.5244 Current Tax Rate \$.5173 Recommending the effective tax rate of \$.5244 a \$.0071 increase. This rate will increase taxes on the average home \$8.20 per year.

Debt Service Tax Rate Buydown Actual debt service payments increased by \$634,334. Recommending to buydown the I&S rate by \$450,000 allowing more of he recommended tax rate of \$.5244 to go towards maintenance and operations.
