The Seguin Commission on the Arts has developed a fiberglass art trail program similar to the painted boots in Wimberley, the mermaids in San Marcos, and the horses in Amarillo.

Seguin's will be painted squirrels placed at sponsoring businesses and other public locations.

CONCEPT



- Once approved, the Arts Commission will begin working with a fabricator to design our mold for all sculptures.
- Here is a sample of a similar trail in Marysville, KS of their black squirrels.



THE DETAILS



- Sponsors will purchase a sculpture for \$2,000.
- It is then their responsibility to find an artist to paint the sculpture. The Commission will work with the Seguin Art League to provide a thorough list of recommended local artists.
- We have developed a 3-party contract to ensure that all parties understand their responsibility.
- The Commission will review and approve all squirrel designs prior to being painted and installed.
- The proceeds from the sale of the squirrels will go to funding other public art projects in Seguin.
