CITY OF SEGUIN

AN ORDINANCE OF THE SEGUIN CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION LAWFUL SPEED LIMIT ON IH-10 FROM MILE POST 12.813 BEING APPROXIMATELY 1500 FEET SOUTHWEST OF SH 46 TO MILE POST 15.127 AT BS123, WITHIN THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation ("TxDOT") is beginning a construction project along IH-10 in the vicinity of SH 46 in Seguin; and

WHEREAS TxDOT has determined that the 75 MPH speed limit should be reduced in the construction zone; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned investigation has determined that for the 2.314 miles spanning from MP 12.813 (approximately 1500 feet southwest of SH46) to MP 15.127 (BS 123)(all mileposts measured from the Bexar County line) will be reduced to 65 mph; and

WHEREAS, this reduced speed limit shall be in force as marked by signs displayed during the construction period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Seguin as follows:

Part One. A temporary construction speed limit of 65 MPH is established on IH 10 from MP 12.813 to MP 15.127 and marked by signs during the TxDOT construction project.

Part Two. Violations of this Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the penalty provisions of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances.

Part. Three. If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable clause or provision shall be severed from the remaining portion of the Ordinance, which shall continue to have full force and effect.

Part Four. In accordance with Section 3.10 of the Seguin City Charter, this Ordinance shall become effective upon ten (10) days following its passage and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.
