Following the June 4 City Council meeting, the proposed boundaries for Seguin's TIRZ #1 were shared with the downtown business community and a presentation was provided to the downtown businesses on July 1. Staff has received no comments from the downtown businesses on the proposed boundaries.

Per the discussion at the June 4 City Council meeting, discussion on the boundaries of the TIRZ #1 was to come back to City Council for further comments and discussions. Should Council want to make amendments to the proposed boundaries, please keep the following in mind:

- The larger the boundaries, the more future revenue will be removed from the City's general fund.
- No more than 30% of the properties can be used for residential uses at the time of creation of the TIRZ.
- Want to capture areas where there is the potential for large increases in the taxable value of properties to increase the increment that is invested back into the zone.
