**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS
ADOPTING A DRAINAGE MASTER PLAN; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the management, including collection and direction of stormwater drainage runoff within the City, protects the public health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to address water quality and environmental issues that generally burden stormwater drainage infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to protect against surface water overflow, standing surface water, and pollution arising from nonpoint source stormwater and drainage runoff within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City makes no representation that all stormwater drainage problems may or will be remedied; and

WHEREAS, City Council has adopted a Stormwater Criteria Manual to govern the planning and design of stormwater infrastructure and flood risk analysis within the City of Seguin and within all areas subject to its authority as they proceed to development; and

WHEREAS, the Stormwater Utility Plan included a recommendation to develop a Drainage Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, utilizing hydraulic and hydrologic modeling in conjunction with historical flood data and consultation with City staff, fifteen (15) risk areas were identified based on structural flood risk, street flood risk, neighborhood access, and reported flood complaints; and

WHEREAS, proposed projects have been assessed to be the apparent, most cost-effective solutions while reducing the risk of flooding within risk areas; and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends adopting the Drainage Master Plan as a guiding document and prioritization of stormwater projects in order to reduce flood risk.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Seguin, Texas:

SECTION 1. The City adopts the Drainage Master Plan as the guiding document and prioritization of stormwater projects in order to reduce flood risk.

SECTION 2. The City of Seguin acknowledges that flood risk is real and the City is dedicated to minimizing the loss of life and property that is associated with flooding events.

SECTION 3. This resolution is effective on the date of its passing.
