James Lee, M. D., 202 Wedgewood, Seguin, Texas; Dr. James Lee gave the GRMC Fiscal Year Budget Update for October 1, 2023- September 30, 2024. Dr. Lee gave the Summaries of the Budget and started by saying that everyone knows that GRMC is the last City/County owned Hospital in Texas, planning, thoughts and the health needs of the community is what the hospital needs to know and then we tailor our programs to meet those needs, Dr. Lee states we need to have the right tools to be the best that is expected, so that means we have to invest in technology and having to spend a lot of money on upgraded everything in the Hospital. Dr. Lee states that with medicine it last only about five years and then it is out of date. The process begins again, including the IT Department within the Hospital also stating the Women's Center that has be developed within the last couple of years has receive kudos from the community. Dr. Lee states a lot of the money goes to new equipment and personnel, also stating that the hospital has to be prepared for the unexpected, example Covid.

Kody Gann, Chief Financial Officer gave the rest of the Budget Update. Also introducing the rest of the Administrative Staff for Guadalupe Regional Medical Center.

About Texas State Technical College

### \*TSTC Funding Model is Unique:

The only college in Texas that operates on a 100% outcomes based funding formula. The College is not funded on contact hours, but rather on the employment outcomes realized by our students. The College relies on the placement of its graduates in great-paying jobs to receive funding from the State.

### House Bill 4997

- \*Service area jurisdiction rules previously prevented TSTC from providing their programming without the established district community college first declining to serve as the education provide.
- \* Authorized by Kuempel & Issac. Sponsored by Campbell
- \*Passed 6/11/23. Signed by Governor & Effective Immediately
- \*Allows TSTC to operate by right in Comal and Guadalupe counties
- \*Gives TSTC flexibility to immediately bring in new programs without going through the process of offering right of first refusal each time.
- \*With passage of House Bill 4997, TSTC now has the authority to build a campus or campuses in Comal and or Guadalupe Counties

Proposed Seguin/NB TSTC Campus Details

\*Location: Seguin or New Braunfels

\*Land Requirement: 80 to-100 acres

\*Anticipated to be 1/3 smaller that Fort Bend Campus

\*Project Cost: \$100 Million \*

\*Potential Education Programs: Welding, Industrial System, Robotics & Industrial Controls Technology, Electrical Power & Controls, Machining, HVAC Technology, Line Worker Technology, Diesel Technology

\*Earliest Campus Construction would start is 2026/27. Timeline dependent on meeting fundraising goals.
