4. Workshop - Presentation, SSLGC - Dudley Wait, President & Amber Beard, SSLGC General Manager

Amber Beard, SSLGC General Manager, and Dudley Wait, President gave an overview of the establishment of the SSLGC. SSLGC was formed under Subchapter D of Chapter 431 of the Texas Transportation Code in 1998. The initial Gonzales wellfield and water treatment plant started producing water in 2002. Ms. Beard provided the organizational structure of the corporation and the consulting & professional services utilized by the organization. There was a presentation and discussion on the Water Rights, which include:

Gonzales County

- * 4,600 acres owned
- * 16,000 acres leased
- * \$2.2. million annual lease payments
- * Permitted water rights from GCUWCD: 19,356 acre-feet/year (6.3 billion gallons)

Guadalupe County

- * 1,500 acres owned
- * 10,900 acres leased (265 acres of county roads provided by Guadalupe County)
- * \$520,000 annual water lease payments to landowners
- * Permitted water rights from GCGCD: 5,323 acre-feet/year (1.7 billion gallons)
