5. <u>Hearing of Residents:</u>

Chris Rangel, 606 Dolle, introduced Hailey with Texas Lutheran University and invited everyone to participate in the West End Neighborhood Project Clean-Up that will take place on Saturday, March 1st from 8-11:30 A.M. He announced that the hours of operation were firm and that they will not accept hazardous waste, tires, or brush. Also, he gave out his phone number in case anyone was willing to help or provide a trailer. Mr. Rangel thanked the City of Seguin and Waste Connections, LLC for their continued support. Also, he added that he really likes the new backstops at Pachanga Park.

Police Chief Jason Brady recognized the employees that received the Police Departments annual awards: Civilian of the Year, Brendon Moore, Animal Services Field Supervisor Rookie of the Year, Blakely Harvey, Police Officer DWI Enforcement, Michael Godinez, Police Officer Officer of the Year, Tracy Wilson, Police Officer Supervisor of the Year, Jesse Lopez, Police Corporal 30 Years of Service, Willie Ybarra, Police Officer

Mayor Dodgen announced that she wanted to recognize the award winners at this meeting because the Police Department hosted the City's Christmas Party this year so they did not have their normal awards banquet.

Police Chief Jason Brady invited all to participate in the Citizens Police Academy.

Parks and Recreation Director Jack Jones gave an update on the status of the Central Park Fountain, stating that the lights work on it now, but there is a leak in the base of the fountain and it loses about a foot of water a day. There is someone scheduled to come detect the leak on Thursday.

Jackson Biesenbach, 362 E. Cedar, stated that he likes Steve Parker because he says the right things and does the right things. He said Mr. Parker deserves to still be the City Manager because he is nice and kind.

Fire Chief Dale Skinner invited all to participate in the Citizens Fire Academy Class, where attendees not only learn about the department but get to experience it by doing things like putitng on bunker gear, using a fire hose and the jaws of life. Registration is open to anyone who lives or works in Seguin. Classes are held on Thursdays and start on Thursday, March 27th.

Mayor Dodgen thanked Mr. Donnelly for facilitating the Hazardous Waste Collection event as it is difficult to host and it takes a lot of reporting as everything that is taken in must be documented and accounted for. She informed that the event will be funded by grant money.

meters for use by the City's Electric and Utility Services Department; and
declaring an effective date. - Freddy King, Manager of Electric Utilities

Utilities Director Tim Howe informed that he will present this item because Freddy King is attending his son's play-off basketball game. Mr. Howe informed that in 2008 the City implemented an automated meter reading system (AMR) for both water and electric meters that allowed the City to move away from a handheld meter reading system. Aclara Technologies is the software provider that was selected. Techline, Inc. *is the City's account holder and who the City must purchase Aclara products from. This resolution would authorize the purchase of 300 meters for a total cost of \$63,432. Funding for this purchase will come from the Utility Fund Electric Inventory account.*

Senior Utilities Engineer Terri Ruckstuhl explained that the presented change order is for required additional services to relocate the existing 12-inch water main out of TxDOT right -of-way along SH-123 Bypass to within the existing easement of the 24-inch transmission main that is currently under construction. Additionally, the existing 8" water main crossings along SH-123 Bypass will be replaced with 12-inch water main crossings. Guerra Underground, LLC provided the City with a proposal in the amount of \$1,411,588.70, and staff is requesting an additional \$138,411.30 for contingency, for a change order total not to exceed \$1,550,000. Funding for this project will be provided through certificates of obligation.

Parks and Recreation Director Jack Jones reminded that the City may be exempted from the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services licensing requirements for child-care facilities if certain criteria is met. To meet that criteria, the City must hold an annual Public Hearing regarding the Standards of Care for Youth Recreation Programs and formally adopt it by ordinance. The ordinance must include staffing ratios, staff qualifications, facility, health and safety standards and the method used to monitor and enforce those standards. Additionally, the Standards of Care must be provided to the parents of each program participant and parents must be informed that the program is not operated or advertised as a licensed daycare. Mr. Jones explained that the differences in this year's Standards of Care is that a \$10 cancellation fee has been for the Summer Day Camp Program and a Swim Ability Waiver have been added. Updates to the volunteer and visitor policy were made as well.

Mr. Jones informed that the Parks and Recreation Commission approved the proposed changes to the Standards of Care at their February 3rd meeting.
