MEASURE NO. 2

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 3.02 of the City Charter to allow a person to fulfill an unexpired term without that period of time counting against term limits as long as the unexpired portion of the term is less than two years.

MEASURE NO. 2

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 3.08 of the City Charter to allow the City Council greater flexibility in setting regular dates for City Council meetings.

MEASURE NO. 3

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 3.10 of the City Charter to allow the City to publish newly passed ordinances as required by State law rather than by a specific means.

MEASURE NO. 4

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 5.02 of the City Charter to make provisions for the appointment of additional associate judges for the municipal court and to provide for a presiding judge.

MEASURE NO. 5

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 5.04 of the City Charter to remove the requirement of council to set the salary for the city attorney and to provide a procedure for the hiring of such assistant city attorneys as the needed.

MEASURE NO. 6

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 10.02 of the City Charter to change the method of presentation of the budget to the city council to that required by State law.

MEASURE NO. 7

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 10.04 of the City Charter to change the method of publication of the City Budget to publication in the manner required by State law.

MEASURE NO. 8

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 10.09 of the City Charter to change the primary method of copying the City budget to electronic copies and make provisions for paper copies where needed.

MEASURE NO. 9

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 11.02 of the City Charter to publish notice of franchises on the City website.

MEASURE NO. 10

<u>FOR/AGAINST</u> The amendment of Section 11.09 of the City Charter to publish the audit of City utilities on the City website or as otherwise required by State law.
