CITY OF SEGUIN

AN ORDINANCE OF THE SEGUIN CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING THE
LAWFUL SPEED LIMIT WITHIN THE TOWNWOOD VILLAGE SUBDIVISION,
WITHIN THE CITY OF SEGUIN, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES;
PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE;
PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND AUTHORIZING
CITY STAFF TO PREPARE THIS ORDINANCE FOR SUBMISSION AS A
SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the Townewood Village Homeowner's Association has requested that the city lower the speed limit in their subdivision from 30 mph to 25 mph; and

WHEREAS, the subdivision has a single access to Middletown Road; and

WHEREAS, due to its limited access a lower speed is not unwarranted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Seguin as follows:

Part One. The first recitals set forth above are hereby adopted, in full, as part of this Ordinance.

Part TWO. Section 98-65(g) of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances is amended as follows (underlining indicates added text, ~~striketrough~~ indicates deleted text):

(g)Speed limit of 25 mph.

Running Creek

Meadow Run

Unity Road

Eagle Ridge

New World

Old Homestead

Mill Creek Subdivision—All streets

Ridge View Estates Subdivision—All streets

Greenspoint Heights Subdivision—All streets

Greenspoint Village Subdivision—All streets

Greenfield Subdivision—All streets

Village at Mill Creek Subdivision—All streets

Townewood Village Subdivision – All streets

Part Three. The City’s Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to install signage in accordance with this Ordinance.

Part Four. Violations of this Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the penalty provisions of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances.

Part Five. If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable clause or provision shall be severed from the remaining portion of the Ordinance, which shall continue to have full force and effect.

Part Six. City staff is authorized to prepare this Ordinance for submission as a supplement to the Seguin Code of Ordinances.

Part Seven. In accordance with Section 3.10 of the Seguin City Charter, this Ordinance shall become effective upon ten (10) days following its passage and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.
