- Subject: Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a purchase order for the Tyler Technologies 2023 annual licensing and support renewal
- Date: November 21, 2022

Staff is requesting authorization to renew the annual support agreement for the city's Tyler Technologies software enterprise. There are eighteen Tyler software applications running the city's many virtual business processes. Most of the Tyler software platforms were moved to a coterminous year end renewal in 2020. For 2022 the annual renewal is \$129,216.87, up from \$120,543.02 the previous calendar year. The increase in price is attributed to inflation and the rising costs for technology support and services.

This renewal directly impacts the business process software for Finance, HR, Public Safety, Municipal Courts, Utility Billing, Utility Services, and Planning via the Incode Personnel Management, Content Management, Customer Relationship, Financial Suite, Case Management, and the EnerGov Product Suite. The support agreement allows IT and other city staff operating within these software modules to work with Tyler support personnel for the purpose of troubleshooting software glitches and allows for software patches and cybersecurity updates as to protect the city's technical enterprise from emerging threats.
