STATE OF TEXAS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE SEGUIN CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING AN ALL-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF WEST COLLEGE STREET AND NORTH CAMP STREET; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City received a request for a review of the traffic control on N Camp St between W Mountain St and W Cedar St; and

WHEREAS, the intersection is currently controlled only by stop signs facing W College St; and

WHEREAS, the engineering review of all-way stop warrants in the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices shows that an all-way stop at the intersection of W College St and N Camp St is warranted; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001, the City has general authority to adopt an ordinance or police regulation that is for the good of the government, peace or order of the City and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Seguin:

- **Part 1.** A stop intersection is hereby created at the intersection of W College St and N Camp St within the City of Seguin.
- **Part 2.** The City's Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to designate the intersection of W College St and N Camp St as a stop intersection in accordance with this Ordinance and is further directed to erect appropriate signs or other markings giving notice thereof.
- **Part 3.** Violations of this Ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the penalty provisions of the City of Seguin Code of Ordinances.
- **Part 4.** In accordance with Section 3.10 of the Seguin City Charter, this Ordinance shall become effective upon ten (10) days following passage on second reading and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.
- **Part 5.** If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable clause or provision shall be severed from the remaining portion of the Ordinance, which shall continue to have full force and effect.
