Dan Jackson provided City Council with the 2019 Water/Wastewater Rate Analysis. Factors Impacting 2019 Analysis: SSLGC Cost Increases New wholesale customer will be increasing purchases 2020-2025 Significant forecast new growth, particularly in wastewater Biggest impact: Capital Improvement Plan and \$37 million Geronimo Creek Expansion

Revenues from growth are forecast to cover cost of growth: City plans to contribute \$1,000,000 in impact fees annually to fund growth-related debt service New customers will add more revenue to water and wastewater fund *Mr.* Jackson laid out the proposed rate plans for the Water and Wastewater Utility. Also, showing the proposed rate plan impact to residential and commercial customers on a monthly basis.
