

- > April 27th- Governor Abbott issued "Reopen Texas" Order

 - > Beauty salons, gyms, barbers, bars, bowling alleys to remain closed
 - Museum and Library Guide was also issued
 - Church Guide
 - Sporting Participant Guide

OPEN SEGUIN

City officials will begin Phase I to Open Seguin beginning Friday, May 1, 2020.

The City is following a three-phase plan announced by Texas Governor Greg Abbott on April 27 to safely and strategically open Texas while minimizing the spread of COVID-19.

Under Phase I, certain services and activities are allowed to open with limited occupancy, and the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is issuing minimum standard health protocols for all businesses and individuals to follow.

Gov. Abbott issued the following three Executive Orders relating to the <u>Open Texas</u> plan in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>By way of Executive Order (GA-18)</u>, all retail stores, restaurants, movie theaters and malls are permitted to reopen on Friday, May 1. These services must limit their capacity to 25 percent of their listed occupancy. Within shopping malls, the food-court dining areas, play areas and interactive displays and settings must remain closed. May 18-23

- Continue curbside and laptop service possible increase hours depending on demand
- Main library will remain closed to public staff prepares 1st floor for opening
- Install sneeze guards at 1st floor desk
- Ensure proper distancing between self-checks and computers
- Continue monitoring Gabbie/library email/reserves Mon-Fri 9 a.m. 5 p.m./Sat. 9 a.m. 2 p.m.
- Continue virtual programming

May 25-30

- Open 1st floor to the public following Governor Abbott's guidelines reduced hours of operation
 - ✓ Discourage gathering by removing all lounge seating and limited number of chairs at tables
 - ✓ 1st floor deck will remain closed
 - ✓ Study rooms, conference room and community meeting room will remain closed to public
 - ✓ Mark proper social distancing around the service desk, print release station, etc.
 - ✓ Staff will retrieve materials from the second floor for customers
- Continue curbside
- Continue virtual programming no on-site programs
