The regular meeting was recessed and the public hearing was called to order.

Citizen Comments

Name:Jud Alexander Address:318 Montwood City: Seguin, Texas 78155

Mr. Alexander states that parking on Jay Road is a huge problem, and that Jay road was put in by his family then given to the City of Seguin. It was placed there for commercial verses a residential. Mr. Alexander states that every morning when he

drives to his office both sides of Jay road has parked eighteen wheeler trucks stating all the fire hydrants are blocked by vehicles park along the road, causing a Fire Hazard if the hydrants were needed in a emergency.

Mr. Alexander states that his employees pick up at least a dumpster full of garbage every week. Bottles of urine, pallets, tires etc. Mr. Alexander feels it should have "no parking signs", he is not in favor of permit by parking.

Councilman Rangel asked City Engineer, Melissa Reynolds if staff had met with Mr. Walker, the individual who farms the property next to Jay Road. Ms. Reynolds stated they did not, but he has met with Mr. Parker.

Councilman Rangel also asked who would be patrolling the area if parking by permit were to go through and Ms. Reynolds stated the Seguin Police Department.

Councilman Lievens asked Ms. Reynolds if the parking by permit would only be hotel customers and if it would be stated on the permit.

City Attorney, Mark Kennedy answered for Ms. Reynolds asking Councilman Lievens if he would look at the conditions that are on the back of the permit and proceeds to explain the conditions

City Manager, Steve Parker stated that he has kept in touch with Mr. Walker, stating he is aware and was told of the recommendation. Mr. Parker states that the ordinance can always be amended, stating the Hotels do want a clean environment as well.

Councilman Keller stated that what the hotels need to do is buy some property and make it a truck parking lot. It should not be on city streets.

Mayor Donna Dodgen asked City Engineer, Melissa Reynolds if we could monitoring for a period of time, how would be gather that data. Ms. Reynolds states it would be from the response from the business owners and land owners if trash is still an issue or if there is non compliance we will know fairly quickly. There will be a six month monitor time.

Councilman Jason Biesenbach states that he will be staying consistent with his opposition to parking by permit. Stating "people pay for the streets and if they pay for them they should be able to park there".

Phillip Swoope, Director of Sales for TowneSuite, 2732 Jay Road, Seguin, Texas, 78155; Mr. Swoope wanted to clarify that the hotel does not have a contract with any trucking companies. Mr. Swoope states there is a company called corporate lodging and it does not differentiate between truckers or business travel, stating the hotel does not have a choice on the client if they are signed up with Corporate lodging which is a hotel standard. Corporate lodging is something to help drive business for the city.

Mr. Jud Alexander asked if these businesses will only be able to give a permit for a vehicle to parking in front of there business? Not in front of someone else's or his property?

City Engineer, Melissa Reynolds states that it is not designated in the ordinance now , it states the hotels are the issuance of the permit.

City Manager Steve Parker, begins discussion with stating Mr. Manger has expressed his concerns with staff regarding the vacant buildings downtown and asking how do we revitalize these buildings? Mr. Parker states that staff just wants council to know that we are not ignoring the issue, we are limited to what we can do according to State law.

Director of Main Street, Kyle Kramm states that staff is working with the building owners, trying to give them more time. Stating using citations as a last resort; letting these folks know about the incentive programs to them keep the building from deteriorating.
