Directing staff in the extension of hours for the sale of beer, wine and other mixed beverages for on-premises consumption - Kyle Kramm, Director of Main Street & CVB

Main Street & CVB Director Kyle Kramm presented a request made by The Warehouse, 108 S. Austin Street, to change its on-site alcohol consumption hours to 2:00 a.m. Currently they follow the standard hours set by TABC but if the City approves an ordinance allowing establishments the extended hours, the establishment may apply through TABC for a late-hours permit. If City Council wishes to approve such an ordinance it is recommended that a six-month review be required.

The Warehouse General Manager said the reason for the request was they are trying to stay competitive with the surrounding communities, San Marcos, New Braunfels, & San Antonio. They see a huge amount of their crowd leave on Saturdays around 11:00 p.m. They would like the option to stay open until 2:00 a.m.

Members of City Council were concerned that extending the hours would lead to more people becoming intoxicated and then driving on local streets. Also, some Council Members have received calls from residents and business owners about the amount of unwanted debris found on the sidewalks on Monday mornings. Third, City Council asked "could the city pass an ordinance regulating certain hours on certain days?"

City Attorney Andy Quittner advised that State law does allow an establishment to obtain a "late hours permit" through TABC, if their city adopts an extended hours ordinance. By passing the extended hours ordinance would allow all bars within the community to stay open until 2:00 pm 7 days a week, if they choose. The city cannot make changes, such as hours of operation to the permit.

Council Member Lievens stated that the review after six months needed to include

input from all bars, citizens, and the police department.

It was the consensus of the City Council to hold a public hearing before an ordinance is considered. City Council thanked Mr. Stroud for coming forward with his request.
